# Module -1

## Principles and elements of sculpture:

origin and development of imagery in sculpture; classification of sculpture. Fundamentals of sculpture - line, space, mass or volume, shape, value, colour, rhythm or repetition, continuity, emphasis, balance, texture, and proportion.

History of metal sculptures; processes involved in the use of metal as medium for sculpture; physical properties and classification of metals as ferrous and non-ferrous, alloy, etc.; bronze as the primary sculptural metal; the Lost-wax method (*cire-perdue*); indigenous methods including "gravity casting", "sand casting", etc.; melting points of metals; surface treatment viz. anodising, oxidation and partination; welding and forging processes for working with metals; preservation of metal sculptures.

Introduction to various clay bodies and clay preparation methods. Techniques of making Terracotta sculpture in coil process, pinching method, throwing, slab making, texturing techniques. Science of various kilns and kiln making process. Pre-firing and final firing of terracotta in kiln.
